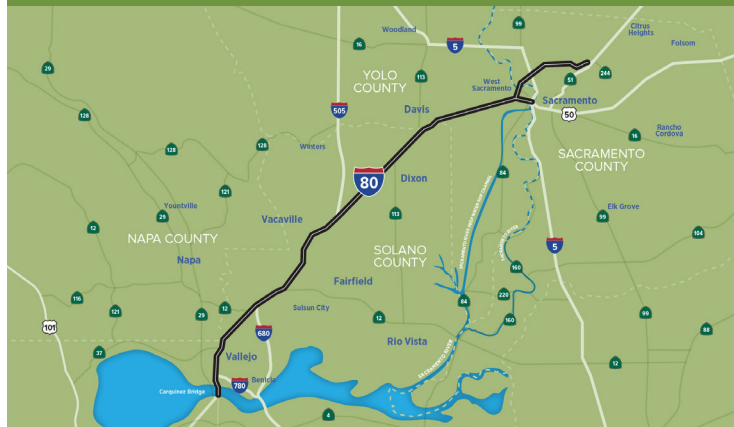
I-80 Comprehensive Multimodal Corridor Plan

MAKING YOUR TRIP EASIER AND MORE RELIABLE

Caltrans is preparing the I-80 Comprehensive Multimodal Corridor Plan (CMCP), a long-range, comprehensive planning document, with the goal of achieving a more balanced transportation system that addresses community and environmental impacts. It will identify and prioritize potential improvements that address all modes of transportation on the corridor. The CMCP will facilitate and allow collaboration between Caltrans, local and regional partners to apply to regional, state, and federal funding programs.



Study Area



The CMCP covers approximately 70 miles of the I-80 corridor from the Carquinez Bridge in Solano County, through Yolo County and ending at the junction of SR 51 in Sacramento County, as well as a short segment of US 50 between I-80 and I-5.
